From the Gaslamp to the grains of sand, San Diego is praised for its temperate weather, gorgeous beaches, restaurant scene and exciting nightlife. Located on the coast of the Pacific Ocean in Southern California, it should come as no surprise that it is also home to some of the most spectacular views in the country. Be sure to add these destinations to your list for their classic, and sometimes unexpected, stellar

views!

One of San Diego's hippest areas, North Park, is just the place for a unique view of America's Finest City. This vibrant neighborhood is full of energy and lots of people watching. Stretching across University Avenue is the famous North Park sign. It welcomes visitors and locals alike into the heart of North Park and is absolutely Instagram-worthy! Located steps from the sign is [West Coast Tavern](#), a laidback urban restaurant with Old World-inspired décor. West Coast Tavern found its home in one of North Park's historic buildings, making its ambiance and location one of San Diego's greatest. Grab a table on the front patio for striking views of the North Park sign and the vivacious passersby.

[Pacific Beach AleHouse](#) prides itself on great food, fresh beer and epic views. Whether you want to enjoy the scenic ocean views from the upper deck or catch your favorite game on one of the 20 flat screens, PB AleHouse is the spot to be. During cooler nights on the deck, the Chicken Chili is the perfect way to warm up alongside the eatery's outdoor fireplaces.



Less than a block from the sand and the Giant Dipper Roller Coaster, Sandbar is a must if you're looking to enjoy a classic SoCal view. Situated in Mission Beach, the Sky Bar on Sandbar's upper level provides the ideal spot to enjoy sweeping views of the Pacific. While relaxing, enjoy a TKO Taco and experience for yourself what the hype is all about! The renowned taco is a three-time winner of the

Best Fish Taco title from the San Diego Bay Wine & Food Festival.

Venture downtown and visit San Diego's Gaslamp, a 16 ½ block historical neighborhood that is now the site of acclaimed restaurants and bars. After snapping a picture on bustling Fifth Avenue in front of the "Historic Heart of San Diego" sign, swing by Union Kitchen & Tap. Kick off your evening or weekend with their Social Hour, Monday through Friday from 3:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. The San Diego Blackened Chicken Wrap, a salute to the fine city of San Diego, is crafted with blackened chicken, corn and red pepper salsa, avocado, cotija cheese and roasted red pepper aioli.

Looking to soak up some sun? Head to PB Shore Club in Pacific Beach, one of San Diego's liveliest areas, to check out "Where Grand Meets the Sand." Mere steps from the beach, PB Shore Club boasts panoramic views of the Pacific Ocean. Whether you go during the day or at sunset, the views from the outdoor deck will not disappoint. The relaxed hotspot features a renowned Red Bull Vodka Slushy and menus for nearly any time of the day and night!

Experience the charm of Little Italy, one of San Diego's finest neighborhoods and the home to some of the best dining destinations in the city. Scenic highlights include streets illuminated with string lights and the Little Italy sign that spans over the community. The neighborhood's Bracero Cocina de Raiz features a spectacular view of its own with their impressive sculpture, The Mexican Labor Agreement. The moving sculpture pays tribute to the struggles of the Bracero workers in Mexico.

Between the beauty of its historic neighborhoods and the crashing waves on the shore, the stunning sunsets near San Diego offers amazing views. These six San Diego hotspots allow diners to enjoy mouthwatering meals and scenic (and people watching) sites!
